MANAGEMENT REPORT OF FUND PERFORMANCE

WisdomTree Asset Management Canada, Inc. (“WisdomTree”) is pleased to provide you with the Interim Management Report of Fund Performance (“MRFP”) for the WisdomTree U.S. Quality Dividend Growth Variably Hedged Index ETF (the “ETF”) for the period ended June 30, 2018. The ETF trades on the Toronto Stock Exchange (the “TSX”) under the ticker symbol DQD.

WisdomTree is the trustee, manager and promoter of the ETF. BNY Mellon Asset Management North America Corporation (the “Investment Advisor”) is the investment advisor to the ETF.

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The investment objective of the ETF is to track, to the extent possible, the price and yield performance of the WisdomTree U.S. Quality Dividend Growth Index Variably CAD-Hedged (the “Index”), before fees and expenses. The Index is a fundamentally weighted index designed to provide exposure to dividend-paying U.S. companies with growth characteristics, while at the same time variably hedging currency exposure to fluctuations between the value of the U.S. dollar and the Canadian dollar.

The investment strategy of the ETF is to invest in and hold a proportionate share of the constituent securities of the Index, or other securities, to track the price and yield performance of the Index. The ETF uses derivative instruments to variably hedge currency fluctuations in the relative value of the U.S. dollar against the Canadian dollar, which may range from 0% to 100%, and is based on certain quantitative signals (namely, interest rate differentials, momentum and value).

Risk

No material changes were made which affected the overall level of risk associated with an investment in the ETF for the period ended June 30, 2018. The overall level of risk associated with an investment in the ETF remains as disclosed in the most recent prospectus.

Results of Operations

For the six months ended June 30, 2018, the ETF returned 2.02% versus the Index return of 2.29%. The difference in performance of the ETF relative to its benchmark Index is related to management fees and other miscellaneous factors.

The U.S. equity market, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 2.36% in U.S. dollar terms and 7.77% in Canadian dollar terms for the six-month period ended June 30, 2018. The period was characterized by volatility and consolidation which can be segmented into three periods of time. The early part of the period exhibited a strong rally in U.S. stocks in the wake of U.S. tax reform. This rally gave way to a market correction with two main causes. The first of these causes was the retreat of markets away from the relatively high risk appetite to more normal levels. The second cause was fears over the pace at which borrowing rates, namely U.S. 10-year Treasury yields, were rising and the potential implications of those rates on the economy. The remainder of the period ending June 30, 2018 can be characterized as a digestive period where the market works through the volatility of the earlier part of the year. This period was characterized by constructive performance as equity markets regained losses from earlier in the period. Momentum in information technology and consumer discretionary powered the bulk of the gains in the U.S. market, each returning 11% in local currency returns respectively. Conversely, the two worst performing sectors were consumer staples and telecoms, down 9% and 8% respectively. The ETF benefited from sector weight tailwinds as the portfolio was underweight underperforming sectors, financials and telecoms, by 5% and 2% respectively. Selection effects contributed to underperformance in the ETF’s information technology and consumer discretionary holdings by 1% each as the portfolio held quality companies during this period where momentum was the more dominant factor for outperformance.

The U.S. dollar weakened in the early part of this year as risk appetite increased and money flowed into assets denominated in other currencies. However, through the remainder of the period, U.S. yields continued higher pushing the Canadian dollar to weaken against the U.S. dollar by approximately 5%. The performance of the Variably Hedged Units allowed the ETF to capture some of the tailwinds that a Canadian investor would have experienced had they been fully exposed to the U.S. dollar.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

There have not been any material changes to the management of the ETF. In 2018, WisdomTree published the investment risk level for each WisdomTree ETF, in accordance with the investment risk classification methodology prescribed by National Instrument 81-102 — *Investment Funds*. The ETF’s investment risk level may be found in the prospectus and ETF Facts.

As required by National Instrument 81-107 — *Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds* (“NI 81-107”), WisdomTree has established an independent review committee (the “IRC”) to review all conflict of interest matters identified and referred to the IRC by WisdomTree and to give its approval or recommendation, depending on the nature of the conflict of interest matters.

WisdomTree is the trustee, manager and promoter of the ETF and is responsible for the administration of the WisdomTree ETFs. Each WisdomTree ETF pays the manager a management fee (see "Management Fees" below).

Management Fees

The ETF pays WisdomTree a management fee as set forth in the table below based on the average daily net asset value of the ETF. The management fee, plus applicable taxes, is accrued daily and paid monthly in arrears. WisdomTree may, from time to time in its discretion, waive all or a portion of the management fee charged at any given time.

MER includes the waiver or absorption of certain operating expenses by WisdomTree, while the MER before waivers or absorptions shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by WisdomTree.

⁶ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of average daily net assets during the period.

⁷ Amount represents less than 0.005%.

⁸ The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio manager trades its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio's turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF.

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
PAST PERFORMANCE
